









She was the only Athletics participant from Zimbabwe and participated in 1 500m and cross country. In cross country she came 26th out of 49 participants and in the 1 500m she came 14th overally. Out of the total participants at the Games she was the 4th youngest. We are grateful to the Honourable Minister of Youth, Sport, Arts and Recreation who secured two pairs of spikes for use by Privilege at the Games. The Minister was also the Chef de Mission for Team Zimbabwe. Dr. Kirsty Coventry is a recipient of an Honorary Doctor of Philosophy degree from the Bindura University of Science Education.

#### AFRICA UNION (AU) REGION FIVE GAMES

Nine of the Academy talentees participated in the above event which was held in Gaborone, Botswana, from 6-16 December 2018, as part of Team Zimbabwe. All in all Team Zimbabwe got 16 medals ten of which were from the Sports Academy talentees (4 Gold, 4 Silver and 2 Bronze).

One of our talentees Leon Tafirenyika a 2.1 student in Peace and Governance participated in the 2019 World University Games-FISU held in Napoli, Italy. Leon participated in the 200 m race and qualified for the semi finals after clocking 21: 42s. He had earlier run in the 400m race with a respectable 47:07 seconds. In the 400m heat he came 7th and in the 200m heat he came 3td. Thus Leon is in the top 16 in the 200m and in the top 24 in the 400m of the University athletes an achievement never achieved by any other athlete in Zimbabwe or externally. He could not, unfortunately finish the 400m race due to a hamstring injury. Leon was other only athletics representative to qualify for the World University Games. The second was a tennis player who lost all his preliminary games.

- ·Dickson Kapandura finished 5th in the 400m finals with a time of 48:32
- •Dorothy Kavumbura finished 14<sup>th</sup> in the Triple Jump event. Dorothy is still a Junior who was competing with Seniors for the first time.
- ·Nyasha Mutsetse finished 6<sup>th</sup> in the 800m event with a time of 1:55:66
- ·Tafirenyika Leon finished 6<sup>th</sup> also in his 400m event with a time of 47:43s.

All in all Team Zimbabwe got four (4) medals; one (1) silver and three (3) bronze.
